## Fundraising

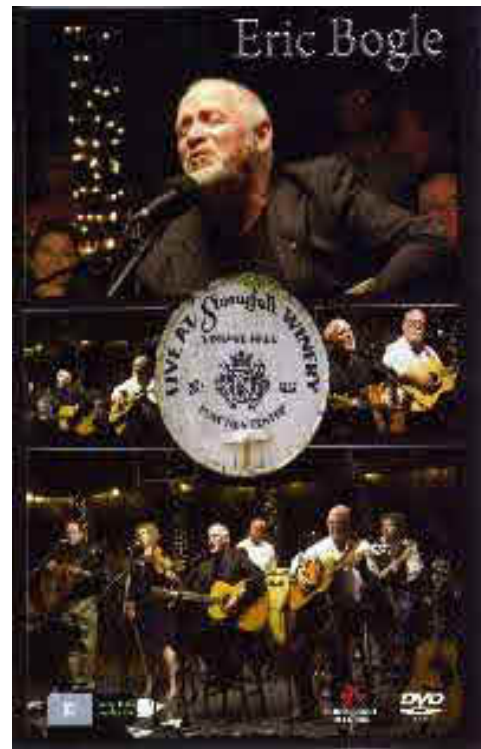

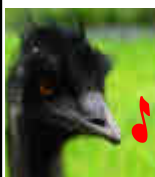

There was great input from all who attended the November "Emu Session" at Roseview Gardens.

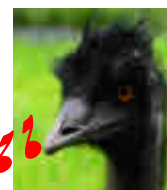
A long table was put together so everyone could see and hear each other better and a new sharing structure was tried out – very successfully!
