5 MINUTE CHOCOLATE MUG CAKE

4 tablespoons flour, 4 tablespoons sugar, 2 tablespoons cocoa,
1 egg, 3 tablespoons milk, 3 tablespoons oil,
3 tablespoons chocolate chips (optional)
A small splash of vanilla extract and your favourite tipple
1 large coffee mug

Add all dry ingredients to your mug and mix well, Add the egg and mix thoroughly, pour in the milk and oil and mix well.
Add chocolate chips (if using), vanilla extract and a drop or two of your favourite tipple then mix again thoroughly.
