### 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Moon Walk

Did you know that Reg Lindsay won a talent contest at the Sydney Town Hall in 1953 and a recording contract. As a pure country artist, he toured Australia, and hosted both radio and television country music programs. After a trip to America in 1969, his style changed as he quickly adopted the more refined sounds emanating from Nashville at that time. Former Kingston Trio member John Stewart wrote Armstrong the song. The single sung by Reg gave him his first big hit on the 1971 pop charts. Worldwide acclaim followed and Reg was recognised for contribution to country music by the Country Music Association of America. (Reproduced from photocopy of unknown source). It was great to hear Armstrong.

### Andy Salvanos comes to Pt Linocoln

Port Lincoln will have a *rare* opportunity on **Wednesday evening, Sept. 30th**, when unique musician **ANDY SALVANOS** drops into the House of Creative Learning, for a workshop / demonstration & mini-concert. He plays a 10 stringed instrument called a 'Chapman Stick' (after it's American inventor) & is one of only a handful of players in Australia, today, & is also a very interesting character ! He promises that he will invite people to "have a go", if they wish to. Watch the Port Lincoln Times for details of this great opportunity! This concert / workshop is made possible by the support of Country Arts SA. Andy has been specially invited to play at the Oysterfest in Ceduna, on the October long weekend, so will be here for one day only, but might get a chance to 'busk' in a coffee bar near you, before the evening workshop. Remember that the rooms at the House of Creative Learning are only small - so get there early !

Swedish-born Andy Salvanos moved to Australia in the 90's. He played with Adelaide bands JBE and Earth Dwellers, and also recorded and performed with Archie Roach on "The Tracker". Since 1988 Andy has played at hundreds of venues including the National Folk Festival (with JBE), The Melbourne Concert Hall (with Archie Roach), The Adelaide Festival Centre (solo) and most of the famous rock music venues in Southern California with various bands. Having attracted the attention of local media, Andy was invited to play at the Adelaide International Guitar Festival in 2008, where he also hosted a Chapman Stick workshop and was a featured South Australian artist during the event launch. He is also an avid street performer, and can be seen regularly in Adelaide's Rundle Mall or Central Market. **Don't miss this Unique Chance to hear & play "The Stick" !!
